



THE ROBERTSON BURROW COMMUNITY OP SHOP GRANTS INFORMATION

The Robertson Burrow Community Op Shop is a not-for-profit, community owned and volunteer run organisation. Its goal is to reduce landfill by giving goods a second life; recycling, reusing and repurposing where possible. Profits are primarily redistributed by grant application back into community programs and projects in the village of Robertson and its immediate neighbouring localities. Other worthwhile projects are identified and supported by the volunteer Committee members who operate the Op Shop.

Grant Program Information

Eligibility

To be eligible to apply for community grant funding, the project or program must be a not-for-profit activity involving residents of the village of Robertson or immediate surrounding localities (Mount Murray, East Kangaloon, Kangaloon, Burrawang, Avoca, Fitzroy Falls, Wildes Meadow etc.) The project or program must be implemented in these immediate locations or by residents (in the case of scholarships for example).

The project or program must provide a positive impact or outcome for the community. Project or program types can include (but are not limited to) events, scholarships, community beautification, community engagement and support, sporting team support and more.

The project or program must have clear objectives which are required to be met within 12 months after the grant is approved. The project or program must have at least one person who is directly responsible for implementation.

Grant Availability

There will be a limited number of grants available each month to a maximum of \$1500 per grant.

Applications will be reviewed by The Robertson Burrow Community Op Shop Committee, then scored and ranked according to the listed selection criteria.

Successful and unsuccessful applicants will be notified in writing. The Robertson Burrow Community Op Shop Committee reserves the right not to award available grant funds should there be no applications deemed suitable.

Selection Criteria

1. What is the exact community need your project or program addresses and why is it important?
2. What do you expect to be achieved within the 12 months time frame of the grant?
3. Specifically, what will the funds go towards in relation to your project or program? Please provide a quote or invoice if applicable.
4. Will there be other sources of funding for this project or program as well? If so, please outline.
5. In what location will the project or program take place?
